THE MUSEUM PROJECT

The Museum Society has been actively collecting artefacts and archives concerning Kings Langley and Chipperfield for over 35 years. It has built up an impressive collection of documents including many transcribed from originals in the County Records Office. The Society also owns a vast collection of photographs and has access to many more. Both of these collections are housed in the Library where they are accessible to the public.

A further collection of artefacts is stored at the Dacorum Heritage Trust (DHT) Store at Berkhamsted. The Society is a founder member of DHT, which is the Museum Authority for the Dacorum area.

Kings Langley Local History and Museum Society is committed to establishing a museum in the district. This is to display its collection of artefacts and also the significant Ovaltine archive, in an attractive manner accessible to the public. The Society is in the process of raising funds to achieve this.

The Society would be pleased to hear of any local premises which may be available and suitable for a museum.

A group of archivists meet in the village library on Wednesday mornings between 10 and 12.30 to research and index local heritage documents as well as receive enquiries on family and local history from individuals (by mutual appointment) and from the Society's Website from around the world.

Kings Langley's recent history has been well recorded on film and video and the Society arranges showings from time to time.

The Kings Langley Local History and Museum Society exists to recount the history of the Village and make it more widely known. Kings Langley has an extraordinary history of which few other villages can claim, including:

A Roman settlement and thriving Domesday community.

A royal hunting lodge at the time of Henry III and a royal palace between the reigns of Edward I and Henry IV.

A Dominican friary from Edward II to the Dissolution.

A 14-15th century church containing the tomb of Edmund, son of Edward III, and 1st Duke of York.

A succession of mills from Norman times to the 20th century.

The manufacture of world famous Ovaltine, from 1913 to 2002.

A wealth of transport history – a Roman road, a turnpike, the M25, the Grand Union Canal, the Stephensons' railway to Birmingham and beyond.
